Posture towards Satan		
 Peter does not dwell much on Satan and his activity. Yes, we are to be aware of the devil's and his intentions and resist him, but we must understand our suffering to be coming from the mighty hand of a loving Father.



6. Conclusion: The relationship between sin, suffering, God, and Satan
