	• Reason 1: God is me through "trial purifying faith" for salvation (1:5-7; 5:10-11)
	• Reason 2: I am a participant in Jesus' life and to the world (2:4-12; 20-25; 4:1-6)
	• Reason 3: I am in with the devil (4:17-22; 5:6-9)
þ	Summary: I am suffering because God is saving me, I am part of Jesus' life and mission to this world, and I am in conflict with the devil.
