SESSION 26: JUDGES

A. Period of the Judges

- 1. Called the Theocracy Rule of God
 - a. No king
 - b. Nation is left to follow the law individually.
 - c. Almost no prophets

2. Period lasts for about 350 years.

- a. Information concerning the period found in:
 - i. Joshua- Final chapters
 - ii. Judges
 - iii. Ruth
 - iv. I Samuel 1-7
- b. About 1/20 to 1/25 the time spent on the kingdom.
- 3. Period of terrible spiritual decline
- 4. Key word *compromise* adjustment of the will of God to personal preference.
 - a. Not total disregard Simply selective.

B. Book of Judges

- 1. Key word Compromise
- 2. **Key man** Samson- Pictures the whole problem of the time.
- 3. Key event- Chapter 2 Message at Bochim
- 4. **Outline** Book is a prophetic account of the period
 - a. Explanation of the Period 1-2
 - b. History of the Period 3-16
 - c. Illustration of the Period 17-21

In those days there was no king in Israel. Everyone did what was right in his own eyes. Judges 21:25

5. Cycle of the Judges

- a. *Chapter* 1- Account of the military failure.
- b. *Chapter* 2- Account of the spiritual failure that resulted from the Canaanites remaining in the land.
- c. Idolatry led to a pattern of experience.
 - i. Sin
 - ii. Judgement
 - iii. Repentance
 - iv. Deliverance.
- d. Because the judgments recorded were military defeats, the deliverance was military.
 - i. Deliverers tended to become rulers after the deliverance leading to the title Judges.
- e. Although the experience was up and down there is also a gradual decline overall- The spiritual tide was going out.

6. Illustration of the period.

a. Two stories given to demonstrate the seriousness of the moral decline.
