 - b. Continues until the captivity to the Babylonians in 586 BC
- C. Judah alone 722-586 BC
- D. Babylon captivity 586-536 BC
- E. Remnant Period 536-400 BC

II. Two Old Testament Historic Records

A. I Samuel - 2 Kings

- 1. Called the Kingdom
- 2. Grouped in the Hebrew Bible in the Prophets
- 3. Perspective is prophetic

Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice and to heed than the fat of rams.

B. 1 Chronicles - Nehemiah

- 1. Part of the Writings in the Hebrew Bible
- 2. Perspective is priestly
- 3. Compiled by Ezra after the Babylonian captivity
- 4. Purpose of the books is to encourage the Remnant to return to God
- 5. Theme: God will meet anyone who will return to true worship
 - a. Key verse:

...and (if) My people who are called by My name humble themselves and pray and seek My face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, will forgive their sin and will heal their land.

(2 Chronicles 7:14)
