A. Saul has been rejected by God although he continues as king

B. Samuel anoints David

- 1. David is the youngest son of Jesse
 - a. Probably about 15 years old
 - b. Already has a walk with God
- 2. Choice is surprising even to Samuel
- 3. Immediately the Spirit of God leaves Saul and fills David
 - a. Saul has the position of the king
 - b. David has the blessings of the king

II. David's Walk

- A. Little is known as to how he came into the relationship with God
- B. David's testimony Psalm 27
 - 1. One thing I have asked of the Lord, that I shall seek. (Psalm 27:4)
 - 2. When you said, "Seek my face." My heart said to you, Your face, O Lord, I shall seek. (27:8)
 - a. The opportunity was by the grace of God
 - b. The experience was by the choice of David

C. Place of growth was in the fields with the sheep

- 1. Unwanted place
- 2. Unheralded place
- 3. God's schoolhouse for David was when David was alone with the sheep

	1. Who is this uncircumcised Philistine that he should taunt the armies of the living God? (1 Samuel 17:26)
	2. Attitude arises from two sources
	a. David knew God personally
	b. David had the anointing of God
	3. Conclusion – David said to Saul, "Let no man's heart fail on account of him; your servant will go and fight with the Philistine. (17:32)
