## I. Micah – Background Information

- A. Period fall of Israel
  - 1. Sins are the same as Amos mentioned
  - 2. Optimism of Amos' day is gone
- B. Contemporary prophets
  - 1. Hosea to Israel
  - 2. Isaiah to Judah (with whom he seems to be familiar)
- C. Micah is the only prophet who formally addresses both kingdoms
- D. Mood of the message is much more quiet and measured than Amos
- E. Style is less formal, more abrupt

- B. Sections 1 and 2 are simply a statement of what God will do
  - 1. Because of sin, God will judge

  - 3. There is no call for them to act on this information
