I. Summary of the Message of Jeremiah

- A. I am watching over My Word to perform it
- B. Behold the kindness and severity of God (Romans 11:22)
- C. Two sides to God's faithfulness
 - 1. **Judgment is certain** because the covenant at Sinai has been broken irreparably God is watching over His Word
 - 2. **Restoration is also certain** because of the covenant with Abraham God is watching over His Word

II. Jeremiah Can be Fruitfully Studied From Various Perspectives

- A. Historically Jeremiah contains insight into the details of the final events in Judah's history
- B. Biographically No other prophet gives us as much insight into his own heart and experience in his own personal life

III. Judgment is Certain

- A. Note the warning to Israel concerning their experience in the promised land
 - 1. The former inhabitants were being driven out because of their sin
 - 2. Israel was called to display the character of God
 - a. If they walked with the Lord this would be an experience of blessing
 - b. If they lived like the nations who had been driven out the experience would be one of suffering
 - 3. I am tired of relenting

Assignment:

Read Jeremiah 23-31.

Note the emphasis on what God will do to assure that the promise to Abraham is fulfilled.

- B. Why did Judah continue in sin when the blessing of God was being removed?
 - 1. They were trapped by their desires
 - 2. They were deceived
 - a. By idolatry
 - b. By false prophets
 - c. By their own hearts
 - (1) They became liars
 - (2) Opened the way for deception

IV. A Way of Deliverance is Provided

- A. God's plan was judgment through the Babylonians
 - 1. The Lord was with the Babylonians
 - 2. The just would live by faith
 - a. Faith ordering your life in terms of God's revealed truth
 - 3. Faith at this point is submission to God's plan for judgment
 - a. Submission to the Babylonians is submission to God
 - b. Opposing the Babylonians is to rebel against God
- B. Exile in Babylon is the Lord's means of preservation
