IV. Recommissioning

- A. Necessary because the reason for the first commission would end with the fall
- B. Need for repentance will still exist
- C. Word concerning the watchman
 - 1. Essentially the same as the first commission
 - 2. When the people say that they are rotting away in their sins, say **repent**
 - 3. Warning that his new message of hope will become entertainment without repentance

V. Messages of Hope

- A. Note again the repeated phrase, "Then they will know that I am the Lord"

B. Series

1. I will shepherd My flock
 - a. I will make distinction among the sheep
 - b. I will make a covenant of Peace
 - c. *Then they will know that I am the Lord 34:30*
2. I will destroy the enemies
 - a. Particularly Edom
 - b. *Then they will know that I am the Lord 35:15*
3. God will bless and make the people new
 - a. Parallel to Jeremiah's new covenant (36:25-28)
 - b. *Then they will know 36:38*
4. The valley of dry bones
 - a. Bring the nation to life
 - b. Put Israel and Judah back as one
 - c. Put David on the throne and make peace with Israel
 - d. *Then they will know that I am the Lord*
5. Gog and Magog
 - a. Israel will encounter difficulties but the Lord will deliver
6. The vision of the restored temple
 - a. Worship will again be what it should
 - b. God will again be in the midst
 - c. Glory of God appears as in the commissioning
