Two key visions: a. Ram and the Goat (Chapter 8) b. Kings of the north and the south (Chapter 11) c. Brief history (1) Medes and Persians ruled from 536-330 BC (2) Alexander the Great destroys the Persian Empire but dies before a new empire is established - 323 BC (3) Land conquered by Alexander is divided between four generals
