I. Adam and Eve as King-Priests
 Genesis 1 and 2 present Adam and Eve as having both a role and a role. They are king-priests.
B. Adam and Eve's Kingly Role (Gen 1:26-28)
 Gen 1:26-28 describes Adam and Eve as God's royal on the earth. They are God's kingly agents commissioned with the task of ruling the earth.
2. The blessing consists in the right to over creation by being fruitful and multiplying, filling, and subduing the earth. God's purpose for mankind was that they would rule collectively as kings, or vicegerents, over all creation.
C. Adam and Eve's Priestly Role
 If the language of Genesis 1 suggests a kingly role, the language of Genesis 2 suggests a role.
 a) If the Garden of Eden was the first sanctuary, the first , where God dwelt among men, then Adam and Eve were the first priests serving in this temple.
b) Ezekiel 28:11-15 compares the king of Tyre with someone who was in the Garden of Eden. Though this is a difficult passage, the being spoken of as being in the garden is most likely referring to (K&D, JFB). What is particularly significant about this passage is the high priestly description of Adam as being clothed with precious
c) In Genesis 2:15, we read that man was placed in the garden to cultivate it and keep it. These two words are important.
(1) "Cultivate" is the Hebrew word "abad" meaning to work or
(2) "Keep" is the Hebrew word "shamar" meaning to watch or
(3) The very next time you see these two verbs together is when Moses explains the duties of the priests (Numbers 3:6-8; 3:31, 36; 4:28; 8:25-26; 18:1-7).
