I. Israel as Participants in Divine Warfare

1 Warfare (fighting those outside the Promised Land):

b) The conquest of Canaan falls under this type of warfare.
B. Excursus: The Canaanite Conquest and the Justice of God
According to Scripture, all human beings are of God and deserve to die. We are all objects of divine warfare.
<ol> <li>The conquest of Canaan was not genocide or ethnic cleansing.</li> <li>Divine warfare is about, not ethnicity. It is an impartial judgment of sin.</li> </ol>
<ul> <li>a) Rich Lusk: "God did not use Israel to invade a peace-loving, righteous peopleCanaanite society was filled with violence, cruelty, idolatry, and immorality."</li> </ul>
