I. Galatians Argues That We are Justified by Faith Apart From any Performance

- A. Problem of "flesh" in man
 - 1. Flesh is the tendency away from God
 - 2. Flesh is the tendency to make myself the center of all things
 - 3. Flesh is not my lower nature It is my nature (Romans 7:18)
- B. But unless we are delivered from our sinful tendencies we are never free to live
- C. Answer is in the new life of Christ
 - 1. Galatians 5:5-6
 - 2. "Flesh" still opposes that
 - 3. Paul in Galatians 5:16-25 describes how the Spirit of God works to bring us to freedom

II. Four Pictures of the Spirit's Work

- A. Galatians 5:16 Walk in the Spirit and you will not fulfill the lusts of the flesh
 - 1. The Spirit of God opposes our flesh
 - 2. Flesh is still a very real part of the Christian's experience
 - 3. When the Spirit works in my day to day experiences I am delivered from the strong pull of flesh
- B. Galatians 5:18 But if you are led by the Spirit you are not under the Law
 - 1. This is not an issue of guidance but deliverance
 - 2. Led as if a blind man is taken by the hand and escorted to a place
 - 3. Denotes walking together not just being given directions
 - 4. The Spirit will lead you to Christ

- C. Galatians 5:22 But the fruit of the Spirit is...
 - 1. Contrast our natures working and His nature causing fruit
 - a. Activity of the sinful nature
 - b. Fruit of the Spirit's work
 - 2. Because the fruit is in accord with the desires of the new life, those who are Christ's have crucified the flesh
 - a. They have entered into a decisive opposition to flesh
 - b. They have come to a decisive dependence on Christ
- D. Galatians 5:25 If we live by the Spirit, let us also walk by the Spirit
 - 1. Walk is different here than in verse 16
 - 2. Walk means
 - a. Make progress to a goal
 - b. To get in step with
 - (1) Generally implies a rhythm being set
 - 3. Everyone is in step with something

III. What is the Spirit doing?

- A. Teaching us the Word of God
- B. Using that Word to point us to Christ
- C. Calling us to exercise faith
- D. Ultimately this leads to a life of love
 - 1. For Christ
 - 2. For others
